The Supplementary Appropriation Act, 2014.

Short title.

Being an Act to make supplementary provision for the services of Sierra Leone for the year 2014.

[1st July, 2014] Date of commencement.

Whereas by the Appropriation Act, 2014 a sum not exceeding three trillion, two hundred and sixty five billion, three hundred and thirty eight million, eighty five thousand four hundred and fifty nine Leones was provided for the services of Sierra Leone for the year two thousand and fourteen;

WHEREAS it has become necessary to provide for the expenditure from the Consolidated Fund, a further sum of two hundred and sixty six billion four hundred and Nineteen million Leones in excess of the provision in the Appropriation Act, 2014 for the several services set forth in the First and Second Schedules:

AND WHEREAS subsection (3) of section 112 of the 1991 Constitution states that where in respect of any financial year, it is found that the amount of moneys appropriated by the Appropriation Act for any purpose is insufficient or that a need has arisen for expenditure for a purpose for which no amount of moneys has been appropriated by the Act, a supplementary estimate showing the sum of money required shall be laid before Parliament;

AND WHEREAS section 48 of Government Budgeting and Accountability Act 2005 provides that a supplementary estimate under paragraph (b) (ii) of sub section (3) of section 111 of the Constitution shall be submitted to Parliament subject to subsection (3) of section 112 of the Constitution and shall be appropriated by a Supplementary Appropriation Act under subsection (4) of section 112 of the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 24 of the Financial Management Regulations 2007 provides that: Where further disbursements are required in respect of a service which-

- (a) could not have been foreseen;
- cannot be postponed without detriment to the public service; or

(c) cannot appropriately be charged to an existing appropriation or which can cause an excess on such estimates,

a Vote Controller shall seek approval or authority from the Minister before an expenditure is incurred;

AND WHEREAS sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 24 of the Financial Management Regulations 2007 provides that where expenditure for such service cannot be met by virement from a programme with savings, provision for supplementary can be sought;

AND WHEREAS sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 25 of the Financial Management Regulations 2007, provides that where a supplementary provision is required as an addition to the original estimates, an application for supplementary funds shall be made by the vote controller concerned to the Financial Secretary in order to seek the approval of the Minister.

Now, THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:-

- 1. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on Commencement the 1st day of July, 2014.
- 2. The sum of two hundred and sixty six billion, four hundred Le266,419, and nineteen million Leones shall be and is hereby granted to the supplemen-President, for and during the year 2014 to be applied for the several tary estimate services set forth in the First and Second Schedules.

Le266,419,000, 000 charged on revenue.

- **3.** (1) The sum of two hundred and sixty six billion, four hundred and nineteen million Leones shall be and is hereby declared to be charged upon and made payable from and out of the Consolidated Fund for the year 2014 and the payment shall be taken to begin immediately after the commencement of this Act.
- (2) Payment of the sums authorized by the Minister responsible for Finance to be issued from the Consolidated Fund shall be taken to have begun on the date of the warrant authorizing such payment.

Accountant General's authority for payment.

- **4.** The Accountant General is hereby authorized and required from time to time upon warrant or order of the Minister responsible for finance to pay out of the Consolidated Fund—
 - (a) the sum of two hundred and fourteen billion, two hundred and seventeen million Leones for the services specified in the First Schedule;
 - (b) the sum of fifty two billion, two hundred and two million Leones for the services specified in the Second Schedule during the year ending 31st December, 2014.

Excess of expenditure

5. The amount from time to time paid for and in respect of expenditure authorized in section 2 shall not exceed in gross the sum of two hundred and sixty six billion, four hundred and nineteen million Leones from the first day of July, 2014 and any balances remaining unissued at the end of December, 2014 shall lapse and shall not be available from making any payment in the following year.
